The Chair called the meeting to order.

ERMS Status

Kurt provided an overview of the current status of the project.

Judge Medd/Judge Nelson moved/second to recommend to the Supreme Court to suspend implementation of ERMS efforts and to include ERMS in the development and deployment of the UCIS replacement system.

Penny Miller suggested that we revisit the docket sheet to allow renumbering.

AR41 Compliance – Search Site
