

DAVID A. BROOKS, PhD, sees both inpatient and outpatients at Archway Mental Health Services at St. Alexius Medical Center. As a Neuropsychologist, Dr. Brooks can assess and advise others with information regarding changes in thinking and behavior for individuals with a brain injury, stroke, suspected dementia or other neurological disorders. Dr. Brooks also evaluates, treats and provides psychotherapy for adults with post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), depression and/or anxiety. Dr. Brooks also provides pre-surgical psychological evaluations for weight loss surgeries, neuro-surgical procedures, etc. Dr. Brooks received his PhD in the Neuropsychology concentration of the school psychology program at Ball State University. He is board certified by the American Board of Professional Neuropsychology and by the American Board of Professional Psychology (Rehabilitation Psychology).

PAUL MILLNER graduated from the University of Mary in 1975. He subsequently attended the University of Northern Colorado and obtained both his Master's Degree and also Specialist of Education Degree in Counseling. Millner joined the Social Work Department at St. Alexius Medical Center in 1979. In 1984, he assisted in the development of the St. Alexius Employee Assistance Program and in 1988 became the Director of that program. In November of 2002 Millner became Director of Archway Mental Health Services. He has been appointed to serve on the North Dakota Board of Counselor Examiners.

WILLIAM A. NEUMANN is the Executive Director of the State Bar Association of North Dakota. He graduated from Stanford Law School in 1968 and returned to North Dakota, going into private practice at Williston and then Bottineau. In October 1979, he was appointed to the District Court, was elected in 1980 and re-elected in 1984 and 1990. In November 1992, he was elected to a ten-year term on the North Dakota Supreme Court, beginning January 1, 1993, and re-elected in 2002. Neumann has been with the State Bar Association of North Dakota since 2005.
