Instructions for a Name Change – Minor Child (Under 18 Years Old)

Important! Read Before Using These Forms and Instructions!

ND Legal Self Help Center staff and Court employees can't help you fill out forms. If you're unsure if these forms and instructions suit your circumstances, consult a lawyer.

ND Legal Self Help Center forms aren't official court forms. Judges and courts aren't required to accept Center forms. There's no guarantee Center forms will be accepted. Use at your own risk.

If you need legal advice or legal representation, consult a lawyer licensed to practice in North Dakota. Go to ndcourts.gov/legal-self-help/finding-a-lawyer for information about finding a lawyer to represent you.

When you represent yourself, you're expected to know and follow the law, including:

- State or federal laws that apply to your case;
- Case law, also called court opinions, that applies to your case; and
- Court rules that apply to your case, which may include:
 - North Dakota Rules of Civil Procedure;
 - North Dakota Rules of Court;
 - North Dakota Rules of Evidence;
 - North Dakota Administrative Rules and Orders; and
 - Any local court rules.

When you represent yourself, you're held to the same requirements and responsibilities as a lawyer, even if you don't understand the rules or procedures.

These instructions and forms aren't a complete statement of the law. They cover the basic procedure for petitioning a North Dakota state district court for the name change of a minor child (less than 18 years old). If the forms don't fit your circumstances, consult a lawyer. There's no guarantee that all judges and courts will accept forms available through the ND Legal Self Help Center. The Center isn't responsible for any consequences that may result from the forms or information provided.

Use these forms and instructions at your own risk.

Requirements for name changes are in North Dakota Century Code Section 32-28-02.

A minor child is less than 18 years old. If a child is 18 years or older, the child is an <u>adult</u> and must petition for a name change on their own.

Who May Use These Forms?

If you meet All of the following requirements, you may use these forms:

- 1. You (the Petitioner) are the parent of the minor child.
- 2. You **and** your minor child are residents of the North Dakota county where you intend to file the Petition for at least six months before you file the Petition.
- 3. Your minor child is either a citizen or a permanent resident alien of the United States.

If you don't meet All of the requirements to use these forms, <u>consult a lawyer</u> for legal advice. A lawyer who agrees to represent you can interpret the minor name change laws, evaluate your options, and give you advice about the best course of action for you take.

What is the Notice of Name Change Publication Requirement?

North Dakota law requires that you publish notice of your minor child's name change in the newspaper before the judge assigned to your case can consider granting the child's name change. (See N.D.C.C. § 32-28-02(4).) An Affidavit of Publication, or Declaration of Publication, from the newspaper is your proof you published the notice.

- If your minor child has a **non-custodial parent** who lives in a different county than the child, publication is **also** required in a newspaper in the non-custodial parent's county.
- A non-custodial parent is a parent with less than 50% of the residential responsibility.

Can I Use These Forms to Ask the Judge to Waive the Notice of Name Change Publication Requirement?

No, you can't use this forms set to ask the Judge to allow you to skip publishing notice of your minor child's name change in the newspaper.

If you want to ask to waive publication of the notice in the newspaper, <u>consult a lawyer</u> for legal advice. A lawyer who agrees to represent you can research the laws related to minor name changes to evaluate whether the laws could be interpreted to allow waiver of publication in minor name change cases.

Criminal History Record Checks

Review the requirements for getting a criminal history record check **Before** you start the name change petition process. The process can take weeks.

Criminal history record check requirements don't apply to minor name change cases Unless the judge assigned to your case has reason to believe you're making the request for any of the following reasons:

- To defraud or mislead;
- Your request isn't made in good faith;
- Your request will cause injury to an individual; or
- Your request will compromise public safety.

If the Judge requires a criminal history record check for your minor child for North Dakota or any other state, you're required to pay all costs associated with the criminal history record check.

If the Judge requires you to complete a criminal history background check for your minor child, you may be directed to the following website to get the child's criminal history background check: edo.cjis.gov/#/.

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Overview of the Name Change of a Minor Child Process

- Step 1. Publish the Notice Of Petition for Name Change in the Newspaper(s); Serve the Notice on the Non-Custodial Parent and Complete a Declaration of Service by Mail. Get the Affidavit(s) (or Declaration(s)) of Publication from the newspaper(s).
- Step 2. Wait 30 Calendar Days Before Completing the Rest of the Name Change Forms
 Gather any written Objections you receive after publication of the Notice.
- Step 3. Complete the Rest of the Name Change Forms.

 You must wait 30 calendar days from publishing the Notice of Name Change.
- Step 4. 30 Days After Publication, File the Original Petition, Declaration, Confidential Information Form, Notice of Petition for Name Change, Declaration of Service by Mail, (Proposed) Order Granting Name Change (Confidential), (Proposed) Order Granting Name Change (Redacted), Affidavit(s) of Publication, and any Written Objections with the Clerk of Court.

 Pay the \$160.00 filing fee or file the completed petition to waive filing fees.
- Step 5. Get Your Minor Child's Criminal History Record Check, If Required to Get One.*

 *If the Judge doesn't require a criminal history background check, skip Step 5.
- Step 6. The Judge Decides Whether to Grant the Name Change

 The Judge may make a decision without holding a hearing, or may require you to appear at a hearing before making a decision.
- Step 7. Request a certified copy, or copies, of the Confidential Order Granting Name Change

If the name change is granted, request certified copies of the **confidential** order.

Step 1:

Complete the Notice of Petition for Name Change Form; Publish Notice of Petition in the Newspaper(s); Mail a Copy of the Notice to the Non-Custodial Parent & Complete a Declaration of Service by Mail

North Dakota law requires you to publish notice of your minor child's name change in the newspaper before the Judge assigned to your case can consider granting the child's name change. (See N.D.C.C. § 32-28-02(4).) An Affidavit of Publication, or Declaration of Publication, from the newspaper is your proof you published the notice.

- If your minor child has a **non-custodial parent** who lives in a different county than the child, publication is **also** required in a newspaper in the non-custodial parent's county.
- A non-custodial parent is a parent with less than 50% of the residential responsibility.

If you don't know the address of the non-custodial parent, review **page 7** of these instructions for tips on how to locate the non-custodial parent.

If you want to ask the Judge to waive publication of the notice in the newspaper, consult a lawyer for legal advice. A lawyer who agrees to represent you can research the laws related to minor name changes to evaluate whether the laws could be interpreted to allow waiver of publication in minor name change cases. You can't use these forms to ask to the Judge to waive publication in the newspaper.

Complete the Notice of Petition for Name Change Form

You, the minor child's parent, are the Petitioner in this name change case.

- ☐ Fill in the top part (caption) of the Notice of Petition for Name Change form:
 - Fill in the name of the North Dakota county where you and your minor child currently live. You and the child must have lived in the county for at least the past 6 months.
 - Fill in your minor child's **current** first, middle (*if any*), and last name.
- ☐ Fill in the first paragraph of the Notice of Petition for Name Change form:
 - Fill in your minor child's **current** first, middle (*if any*), and last name.
 - Fill in your minor child's **requested** first, middle (*if any*), and last name.

□ Date and sign the Notice of Petition for Name Change form:

- Date and sign the Notice.
- Print your name and address.
- If your mailing address is different from your street address, include both addresses. Write or type your mailing address in the blank space to right of the address block.

Publish the Notice of Petition for Name Change in the Newspaper(s)

Caution: N.D.C.C. § 32-28-02 doesn't say how many times the Notice of Petition for Name Change must be printed in the newspaper. N.D.C.C. § 32-28-02 only states that before a Judge can order a name change, the Petitioner must have given 30 days previous notice in the official newspaper of the county where the Petitioner lives and in the official newspaper of the county where the non-custodial parent lives. North Dakota Legal Self Help Center staff can't interpret the law for you. Interpretation of a law requires legal advice. Center staff can't give you legal advice under any circumstances. If you want the law interpreted for you, consult a lawyer.

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ם	Have the completed Notice of Petition for Name Change published in the official county newspaper where you and your minor child live.		
	Publication can be in the print edition, in the e-edition, or both.		
-	Important! If your minor child has a non-custodial parent*, you must also have the Notice of Petition for Name Change published in the official county newspaper where the non-custodial parent lives, if different from where you live.		
	*A non-custodial parent is a parent with less than 50% of the residential responsibility.		
	If you don't know the address of the non-custodial parent, review page 7 of these instructions for tips on how to locate the non-custodial parent.		
	After publication is complete, the newspaper(s) gives you an Affidavit(s) of Publication, or Declaration(s) of Publication. Make a copy for your records. (You file the original(s) with the clerk of court in Step 4.)		
	Important: You can't file any documents with the court until 30 days after publication of Notice in the newspaper(s).		
	You may receive written Objections after Notice is published. Make copies of the written Objections for your records. (You file the original(s) with the clerk of court in Step 3.)		

Within 10 Days of Publication in the Newspaper(s), Mail a Copy of the Notice to the Non-Custodial Parent

- If your minor child has a non-custodial parent, you must mail a copy of the Notice of Petition for Name Change to the non-custodial parent within 10 days of publication in the newspaper(s).
 - The Notice of Petition for Name Change must be mailed to the last reasonably ascertainable post office address of the non-custodial parent, postage prepaid, from a post office in North Dakota.
 - Use diligent efforts to locate an address to serve the non-custodial parent. Keep track of your efforts and the results, including dates.
 - Following are examples of ways to find people for service:
 - Last known address.
 - Contact the U.S. Post Office for more information.
 - Friends, family, employers.
 - Online search engines.
 - Government entities, such as Department of Motor Vehicles or County Recorder.
 - North Dakota business entity search, available at the ND Secretary of State website.
 - Social Security Death Index.
 - Utility companies.
 - Social networking websites.
 - Reverse directories.
 - A reverse directory allows someone to search by phone number to find an address. (Your local public library may have access to reverse directories.)

If you can't find or don't know the other parent's address, contact a <u>lawyer</u> for legal advice and assistance.

NOTE: If there is no non-custodial parent (both parents and the child live together, the other parent is deceased), you skip this step. However, you **must** inform the court in paragraph 7 of your Petition for Name Change and paragraph 4 of your Declaration of Petitioner that you didn't mail the Notice because there is no non-custodial parent (both parents and the child live together, the other parent is deceased).

Complete the Declaration of Service by Mail Form

This document is proof that a copy of the Notice of Petition for Name Change was mailed to the non-custodial parent and the address where it was mailed.

If your minor child has a non-custodial parent, you, the Petitioner, must file a Declaration of Service by Mail with the court to prove that a copy of the Notice was mailed to the non-custodial parent.

Important! The copy of the Notice of Petition for Name Change must be mailed from a United Stated Post Office located in North Dakota by someone who is at least 18 years old!

The copy of the Notice of Petition for Name Change must be mailed by first-class mail, postage prepaid.

The person who took the Notice of Petition for Name Change to the Post Office and paid the postage fills out the Declaration of Service by Mail as follows:

- ☐ Fill in the top part (caption) of the Declaration of Service by Mail form:
 - Fill in the name of the North Dakota county where you and your minor child live.
 - Leave the case number blank. The case number is assigned by the clerk of court when you file the petition and other documents in Step 3.
 - Fill in your minor child's current first, middle (if any), and last name.
- 1. Fill in the first paragraph of the Declaration of Service by Mail form:
 - The person who took the Notice to the Post Office and paid the postage fills in their full name.
- 2. Stop! If this statement isn't accurate, you can't use these forms.
- ☐ 3. Stop! If this statement isn't accurate, you can't use these forms.
- ☐ 4. Fill in the date the Notice was mailed, and include the city, county, and state where the post office is located.
- □ 5. Fill in the name of the non-custodial parent, their mailing address, city, state, and zip code.
- ☐ 6. You're declaring under penalty of perjury that all the information stated in this Declaration of Service is true and correct.

_	Make a copy of the Declaration of Service by Mail for your records. (You file the original(s) with the clerk of court in Step 3.)
	NOTE: If there is no non-custodial parent (both parents and the child live together, the other parent is deceased), you skip this step. However, you must inform the court in paragraph 7 of your Petition for Name Change and paragraph 4 of your Declaration of Petitioner that you didn't mail the Notice because there is no non-custodial parent (both parents and the child live together, the other parent is deceased).
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Step 2:

Wait 30 Calendar Days Before Completing the Rest of the Name Change Forms

The forms in this packet require you, the Petitioner, to tell the Judge whether you received any Objections to your minor child's name change in the 30 days after you published Notice in the newspaper(s).

If you use this packet of forms, you Must wait 30 calendar days from the day after publication Before you complete the remaining name change forms.

- ☐ Calculate 30 calendar days (see Rule 6 of the North Dakota Rules of Civil Procedure):
 - Don't include the date the notice of your minor child's name change was published;
 - Count forward by calendar days, including Saturdays, Sundays, and North Dakota state holidays; and
 - Include the 30th day, **but** if the 30th day is a Saturday, Sunday, or North Dakota state holiday, the deadline moves forward to the end of the next day that **isn't** a Saturday, Sunday, or North Dakota state holiday.
- ☐ If you receive written objections after the Notice is published, make copies of the written objections for your records. (You file the originals with the clerk of court in Step 4.)

Step 3:

Complete the Rest of the Name Change Forms

You, the minor child's parent, are the Petitioner in this action.

Complete the Petition for Name Change of a Minor Form

- ☐ Fill in the top part (caption) of the Petition for Name Change of a Minor Child form:
 - Fill in the name of the North Dakota county where you and your minor child currently live. You must have lived in the county for at least the past 6 months.
 - Leave the case number blank. The case number is assigned by the clerk of court when you file the petition and other documents in Step 4.
 - Fill in your minor child's current first, middle (*if any*), and last name.

North Dakota law requires the minor child to be either a United States citizen or a permanent resident alien of the United States. If this isn't true for your minor child, you can't use these form.
7.	Fill in your minor child's birth year. Don't fill in your minor child's month and day of birth. Your child Must be less than 18 years old.
8.	Fill in your minor child's requested, first, middle (<i>if any</i>), and last name on the correct lines in the box.
9.	This paragraph tells the court that the reasons you're asking to change your minor child's name are listed in a separate Declaration that you complete and file with the Petition.
10.	This paragraph tells the Judge that you believe court appointment of a guardian ad litem for the child is unnecessary. North Dakota law requires the Judge assigned to the name change case to consider whether to appoint a guardian ad litem to represent your minor child's best interests. Stop! If you believe the Judge should appoint a guardian ad litem to represent your child's best interests, you can't use these forms.

☐ 11. Fill in the information related to publishing the Notice of your minor child's name change in the newspaper of your child's county of residence. If you haven't published the Notice, go back to Step One of these instructions. Fill in the date the notice was published; • Fill in the name of the newspaper; Fill in the county for which the newspaper is the official newspaper for notices. ☐ 12. Fill in the information related to publishing the Notice of your minor child's name change in the non-custodial parent's newspaper of residence. (A non-custodial parent is a parent with less than 50% of the residential responsibility.)  - Affidavit(s) of Publication, or Declaration(s) of Publication, (provided to you by the newspaper(s));
 - Declaration of Service by Mail (for the Notice of Petition to non-custodial parent);
 - All written objections you received (*if any*);
 - (Proposed) Order Granting Change of Name (Confidential); and
 - (Proposed) Order Granting Change of Name (Redacted).
 - **Make sure you have a copy of every document for your files!
- ☐ The filing fee is \$160.00. If you can't afford the \$160.00 filing fee, forms and instructions to ask the court to waive the fee are available at ndcourts.gov/legal-self-help/fee-waiver.

File the completed fee waiver forms at the same time as your name change documents.

Make sure you have a copy of the completed fee waiver forms for your files!

Step 5:

Get Your Minor Child's Criminal History Record Check

Stop! Only complete this step if the Judge requires your minor child to get a criminal history record check!!

After you file the documents listed in Step 4, the court notifies you if a criminal history record check is required for your minor child. You're required to pay all costs associated with the criminal history record check.

If the Judge requires you to complete a criminal history record check for your minor child, you may be directed to the following website to get your child's criminal history record check: edo.cjis.gov/#/.

Step 6:

The Judge Decides Whether to Grant the Name Change

**If the Judge requires a hearing:

- A hearing isn't required for Petitions for Name Changes.
- However, the Judge may decide a hearing is necessary. If the Judge decides a hearing is necessary, the Clerk of District Court notifies you with the date, time, and location.
- If you're required to attend a hearing, be prepared to prove everything you included in your Petition and Declaration forms.

**If your minor child has a criminal history and the Judge required you to complete a criminal history record check:

N.D.C.C. § 32-28-02(5) states "if the court issues a name change order for a petitioner who
has criminal history in this or any other state, the court, within ten days after the issuance
of the change of name order, shall report the name change to the bureau of criminal
investigation."

Your minor child's name isn't changed until the judge signs an Order granting the name change.

**If the Judge denies your name change petition:

- If the Judge doesn't sign an Order granting your minor child's name change and you want a
 different Judge to review the decision, go to the "District Court Appeal to Supreme Court"
 webpage at ndcourts.gov/legal-self-help/district-court-appeal-to-supreme-court.
- A Petitioner in a name change case may appeal the final decision to the North Dakota Supreme Court. The Supreme Court Justices review the Judge's final decision and decide if the Judge's decision is supported by the evidence you presented and by the law.

Step 7:

Request a Copy of the Confidential Order Granting Name Change

If the Judge grants your minor child's name change, you receive a copy of the signed and dated Order Granting Name Change.

However, a certified copy (or copies) of the Order Granting Name Change may be necessary to change your minor child's name with agencies, businesses, other entities, etc.

Request certified copies from the Clerk of District Court's Office. Contact information is available at ndcourts.gov/court-locations.

Make sure you request certified copies of the Confidential Order Granting Name Change. The Confidential Order Granting Name Change includes your minor child's full birthdate.

If you can't get a certified copy of the Confidential Order Granting Name Change, get the following:

- A certified copy of the Redacted Order Granting Name Change; and
- A **certified** copy of the Confidential Information Form.

If a **certified** copy of the Confidential Information Form **isn't** attached to the **Redacted** Order Granting Name Change, North Dakota Vital Records won't accept the Order Granting Name Change.

Cost of certified copies:

- \$10 for the first certified copy;
- \$5 for each additional certified copy (if requested at the same time).
