STANDING ORDER FOR ALL ROLETTE COUNTY HEARINGS TO BE HELD BY RELIABLE ELECTRONIC MEANS

[¶1] This Order is entered in response to the current increase in cases of COVID-19 in Rolette

County, and the attendant impact such cases have had on Court proceedings and the Rolette County

Correctional Center operations.

[¶2] Considerations of health and safety of court personnel, court participants, law enforcement

and correctional officers, and others involved in any and all Court proceedings in Rolette County

require this Court to enter this Standing Order. Beginning Wednesday, January 12, 2022, all Court

proceedings in Rolette County will be held by reliable electronic means, whether such proceedings

be criminal, civil, or juvenile, unless otherwise specifically authorized by a Judge of the Northeast

Judicial District. This Order is entered in accordance with Administrative Rule 52, and the reliable

electronic means policy and procedures previously utilized in Rolette County in response to the

COVID-19 pandemic.

[¶3] This Standing Order will be reviewed every 30 days to determine if conditions at that time

result in a continuing need for reliable electronic means hearings, or if in person appearances are

safe to resume.

[¶4] Any further questions regarding these matters should be directed to the Court for

determination on a case-by-case basis.
