Verification of a document is a statement of the correctness, truth or authenticity of the document by the party submitting the document. For example, a verified petition has a statement of the petitioner that the petition is true.

The general rule is a pleading isn't required to be verified. A petition is a pleading. See <u>Rule 7</u> of the North Dakota Rules of Civil Procedure for a list of legal documents that are pleadings.

However, if a <u>rule</u> or <u>law</u> specifically says a pleading or other document must be verified, verification is required.

Review the rules or laws that apply to your legal document to determine if your document must be verified. Look for words in the rule or law like "verified petition," or "petition must be verified."

Pleadings that must be verified include, but aren't limited to, the following:

- Petition for Adoption (See <u>North Dakota Century Code Chapter 14-15</u>)
- Petition for a Deposition Before the Civil Action is Filed (See <u>Rule 27 of the North</u> <u>Dakota Rules of Civil Procedure</u>)
- Petition for Domestic Violence Protection Order (See <u>North Dakota Century Code</u> Chapter 14-07.1)
- Petition to Establish Date and Place of Birth (See <u>North Dakota Century Code</u> <u>Chapter 32-37</u>)
- Petition for Nonparent Custody or Visitation (See <u>North Dakota Century Code</u> Chapter 14-09.4)

If a rule or law says your legal document must be verified, you have three options:

- 1. Use a separate verification form (as above), which you attach to your legal document as the last page;
- 2. Copy and paste the verification statement and the date and signature block from the form above directly after the date and signature block on the legal document; or
- 3. Copy and paste the verification statement as the last paragraph of your legal document, AND use the verification date and signature block as the date and signature block of your legal document.

Caption (Top of Verification Form):

Sign and Date the Verification Statement:

The self-represented party must date and sign the verification statement.
WARNING: By signing your name you're telling the Court that you're telling the truth and that you have a good faith reason for your requests. If you're not telling the truth, if you're misleading the Court, or if you're serving or filing this document for an improper purpose, the Court could find you in contempt or you may be prosecuted for perjury.
